



From the Mountains to the Sea

A two day workshop of lessons and activities about

Day ONE: Land: An exploration of watersheds, ground water, and water quality monitoring using lessons from the Project WET curriculum and others. We will be at beautiful Garland Ranch Regional Park in Carmel Valley. We will be participating in hands-on science activities that are aligned to the NGSS standards.

Day TWO: Sea: We will start at the Carmel River beach and learn a variety of lessons that will teach about the wetlands and the ocean using [California Coastal Voices](#) (an NGSS-aligned curriculum put out by the California Coastal Commission). A panel of people from local environmental organizations will present on opportunities for getting your students to study and care for our local watersheds.

Cost: \$15 for each day or \$25 for both days

CEU's: Continuing Education Units will be offered for teachers completing both days of the workshop. Teachers will receive the **Project WET Curriculum Guide** for attending the 1st day of the training.
