

## PROJECT WET WORKSHOP



The Sacramento Municipal Utilities District invites K-12 educators to join us this Fall for a FREE Project WET (Water Education for Teachers) workshop at the Effie Yeaw Nature Center. This workshop will be an interdisciplinary experience and exploration of activities designed to engage students in learning about the interrelationships between watershed processes, land use and water quality along the banks of the American River, while learning concepts and skills at the heart of Common Core and Next Generation Science Standards. The workshop will include how to do a basic water quality monitoring session with your students.

Project WET (Water Education for Teachers) activities are designed to supplement existing curriculum to promote the awareness, appreciation, and knowledge of water resources in a manner that is fun, hands-on and informational for learners of all ages. We will use these design features of Project WET as we explore the unique natural and cultural resources of the Sacramento region, while gaining greater awareness of the natural world available to the community at Effie Yeaw and concepts, skills and practices that help foster greater appreciation, enjoyment and stewardship of phenomena in students of all ages.

The interdisciplinary Project WET activities include real life scenarios that provide strong foundations for STEAM and Service-Learning programs. Project WET activities are designed to support and expand on existing curriculum, including the use of EEI (Education & the Environment Initiative) curriculum units. This is STEM learning at its best!
