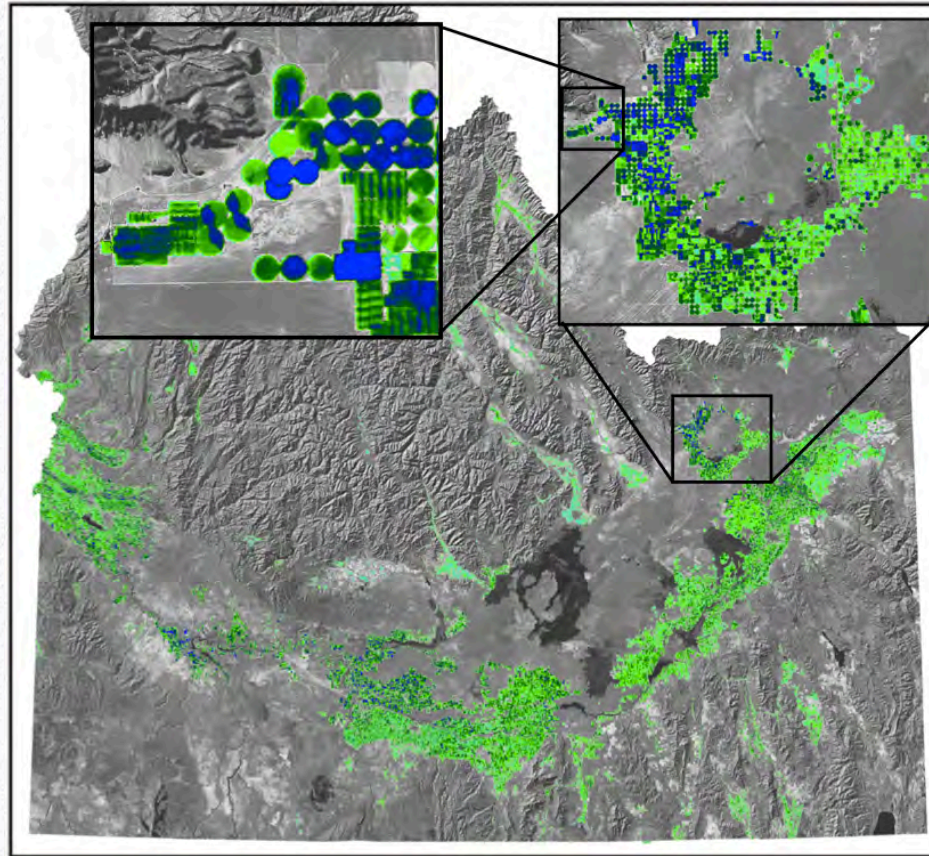

First, Some History

Landsat costs/benefits studied in 1970s

Cost of Landsat satellites in 2012 dollars

	Launch Year	Original Cost in Millions	Cost in 2012 Dollars Millions	Design Life	Actual Life
Landsat 1	1972	\$ 176	\$ 968	1 year	6 years
Landsat 2	1974	\$ 197	\$ 918	1 year	7 years
Landsat 3	1978	?	?	1 year	5 years
Landsat 4	1982	\$ 538	\$1,269	3 years	11 years
Landsat 5	1984	\$ 573	\$1,267	3 years	27 years
Landsat 6	1993	\$ 518	\$ 816	3 years	0 years
Landsat 7	1999	\$ 800	\$1,093	5 years	operating
Landsat 8	2013	\$1,000	\$1,000	5 years	tbd

Dirty Little Secrets

You will save money... and not save money

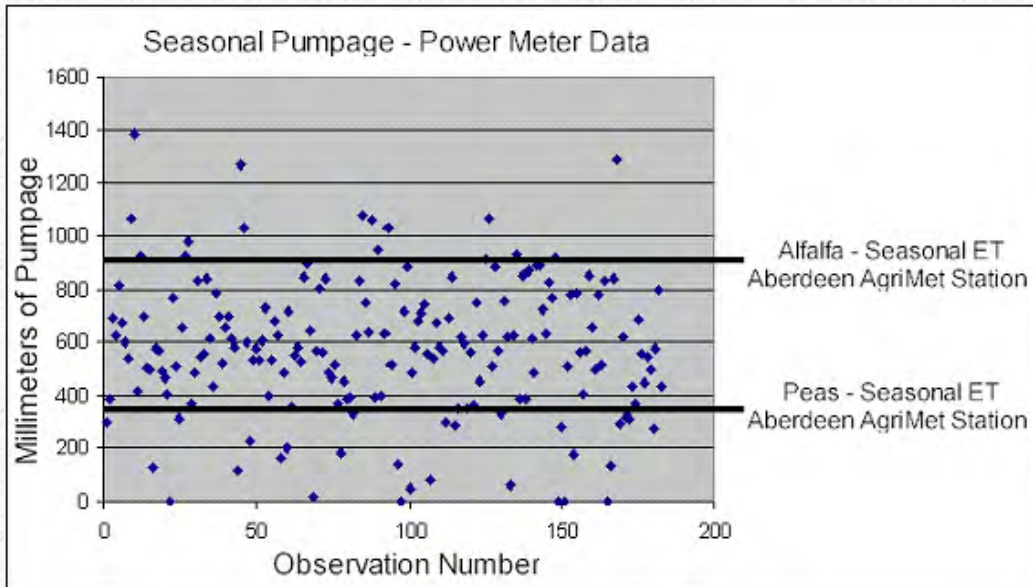
True: Landsat = greater efficiency

Also True: You will do new things

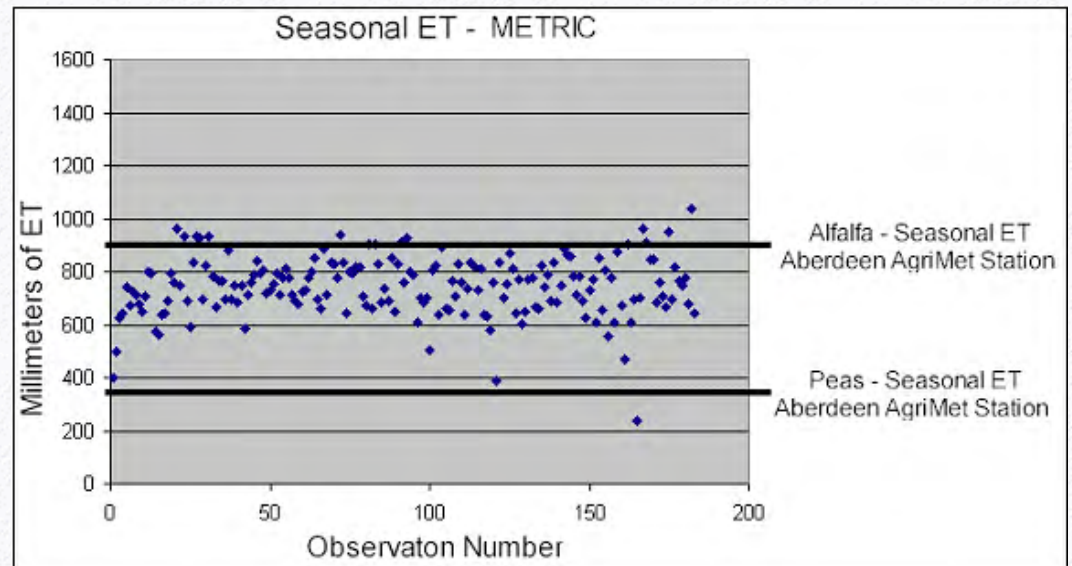
Not an “additional duties as assigned” deal.

Greater Efficiency

Cost: \$119.32 per well



Cost: \$32.15 per field

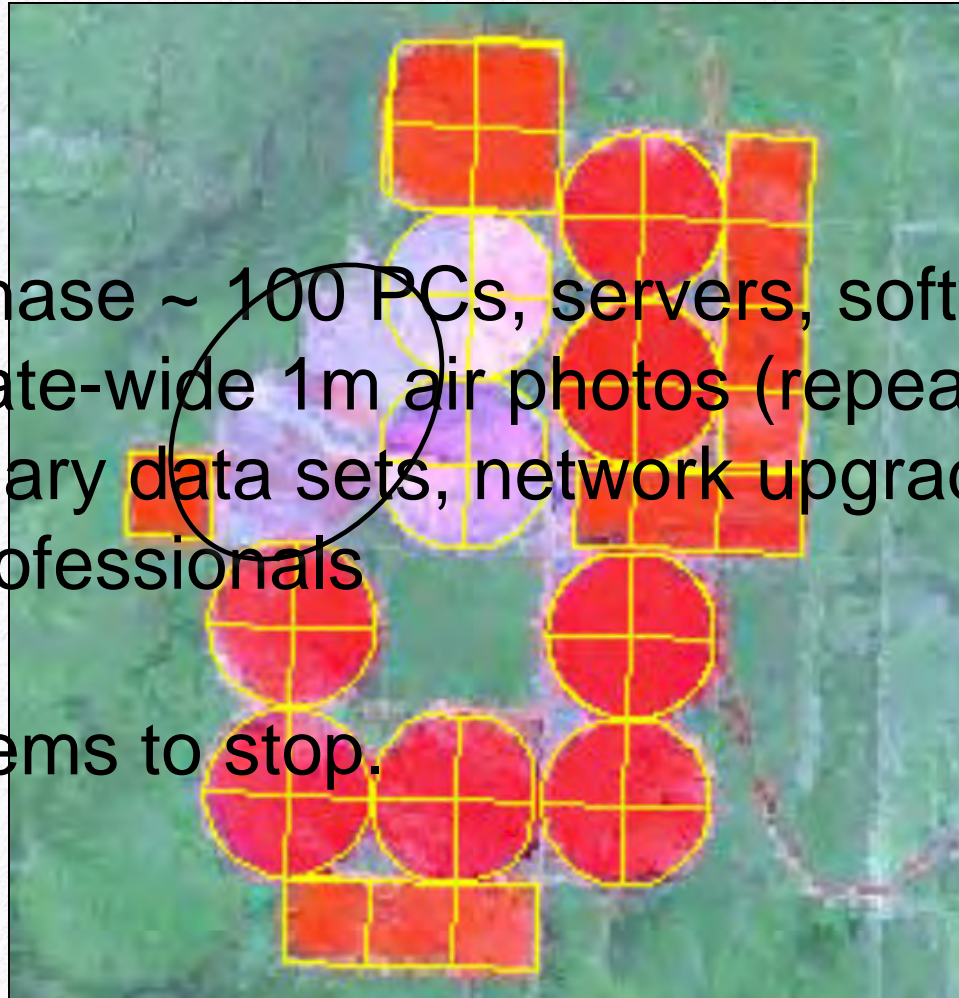
Cost To Do More

Goal: Display water rights on images

Result:

Purchase ~ 100 PCs, servers, software, training, state-wide 1m air photos (repeatedly), many ancillary data sets, network upgrades, hire RS and GIS professionals

Effective basis for negotiation

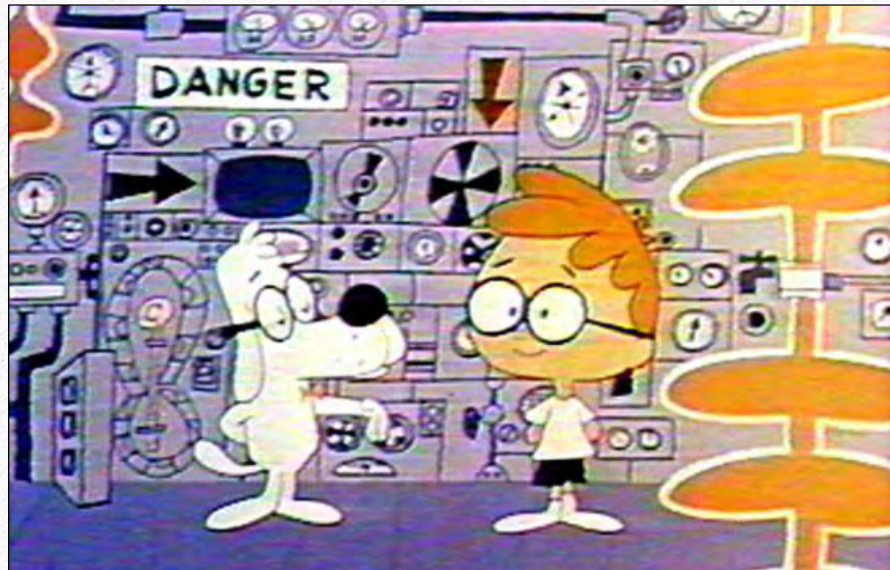
More accurate delineation of water rights

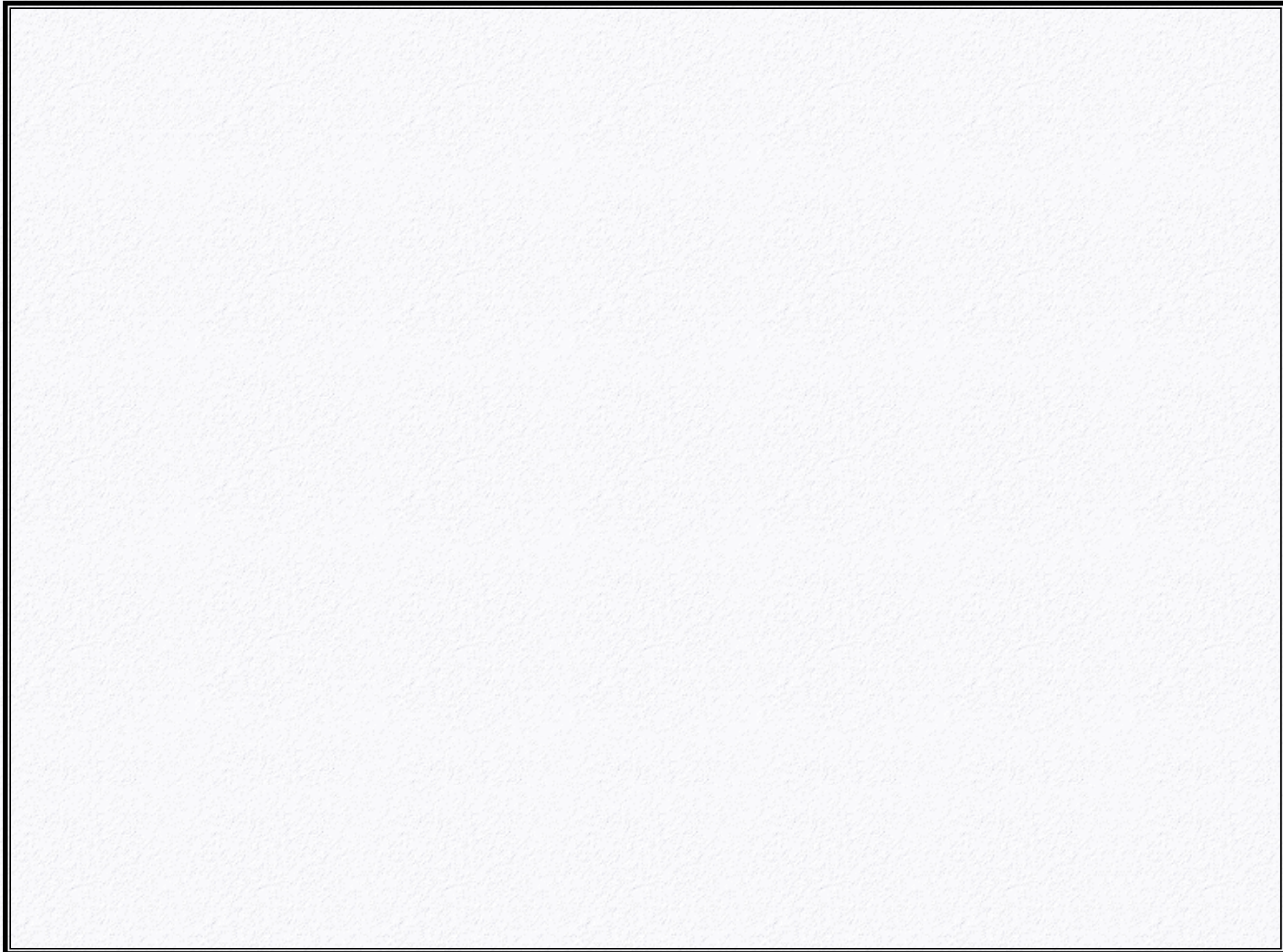
