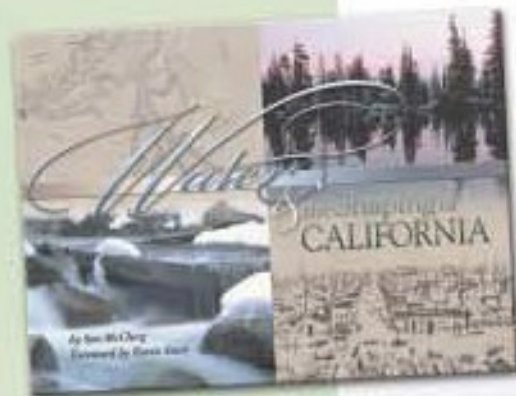

The flagship of the Foundation is *Western Water*, a bimonthly magazine through which readers learn the latest about water supply, water quality, the Colorado River, the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, groundwater, endangered species and more.



The Colorado River Basin is the focus of *River Report*, the Foundation's biannual newsletter that explores such issues as the Colorado River Delta, fish recovery and water supply. The titles in the Foundation's *Layperson's Guides* series reflect a textbook on water: Drinking Water, Environmental Restoration, Flood Management, Groundwater, Water Marketing and more. These easy-to-understand primers are regularly updated and revised.

Tours and Briefings

The Foundation's annual action-packed water tours offer participants a firsthand look at the sites that make water a complex topic in the West and the opportunity to hear directly from leading water stakeholders. Top policy-makers and cutting-edge topics are featured at our annual briefings, which attract hundreds of business executives, legislators, attorneys, news reporters, water board members, state and federal employees and others.



In the Classroom

The Foundation offers a variety of programs to teach students, our future voters and leaders, about water. Students in grades K-14 learn about the history, geography and science of water. All Foundation classroom materials are consistent with the standards of the California State Frameworks for Science and History/Social Science and are designed to correlate with grade-level teaching requirements. The Foundation also serves as the California coordinator for Project WET (Water Education for Teachers), an international K-12 program designed for formal and non-formal educators.

Partnerships

Partnerships with federal, state and local governmental agencies, other nonprofits, water districts, and private industry allow the Foundation to produce Emmy-award winning public television documentaries, poster maps of critical water regions, educational videos, radio campaigns about water conservation and much, much more.

Through such support the Foundation has established special programs such as the Colorado River Project and the William R. Gianelli Water Leaders Class, a year-long program that identifies young community leaders from diverse backgrounds and educates them about water issues.



Problem Solving and Consensus Building

Foundation programs offer often-competing water-interest groups the opportunity to learn more about other views. The Foundation has partnered with many organizations to develop special conferences and briefings and tours to foster collaboration and problem solving among the agricultural, environmental and urban water stakeholders.



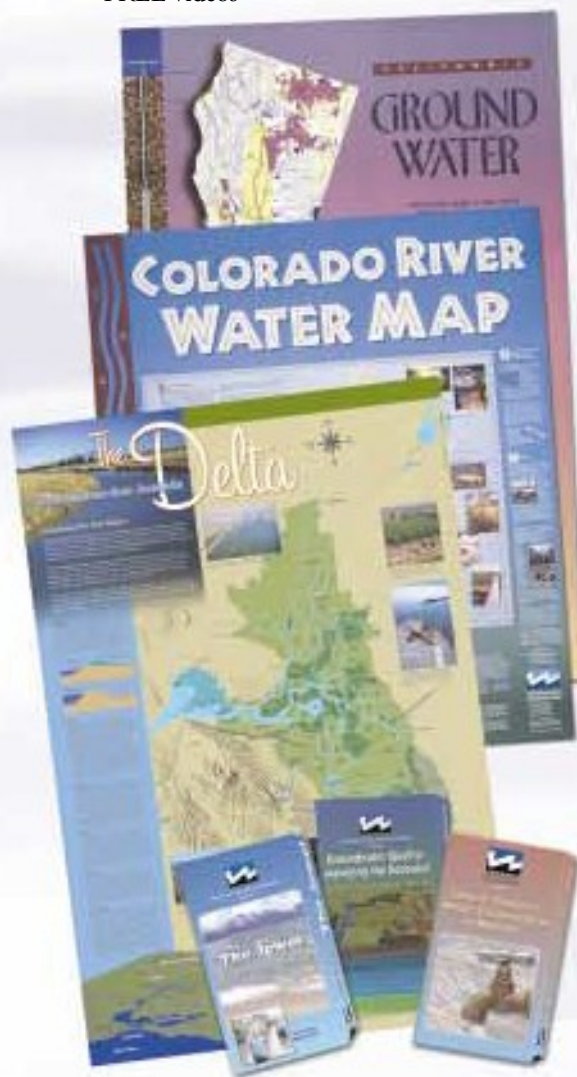
