As droughts become more frequent and more severe, learning to use water sustainably and make water conservation a way of life becomes increasingly important.

In this water-conservation-focused Project WET workshop you will learn activities to use with your students to help them understand why and how we conserve water while reinforcing ELA, social studies, math, and science concepts and skills.

Project WET (Water Education Today) activities are designed to engage students of all ages in the study of water through interactive simulations, use of models, and reality-based scenarios. Interdisciplinary Project WET activities supplement existing curriculum, are correlated to Common Core and Next Generation Science Standards, and provide strong foundations for STEAM, Project-Based, and Service-Learning programs.

Participants attending this FREE training will receive an overview of California weather and climate and how they impact our water resources, experience with great activities to engage students in water conservation, a copy of Project WET Guide 2.0, lunch, an opportunity to receive 0.6 CEU credit - and a \$50 stipend.
