Legislative Calendar

Key Dates:

- Jan. 10 Budget must be submitted by Governor (Art. IV, Sec. 12(a))
- Jan. 22 Last day to submit bill requests to Legislative Counsel
- Jan. 31 Last day for bills introduced in 2017 to be passed bills out of the house of origin (Art. IV, Sec. 10(c))
- Feb. 16 Last day for bills to be introduced
- Apr. 27 Last day for policy committees to hear & report fiscal bills
- May 11 Last day for policy committees to hear & report non-fiscal bills
- May 25 Last day for policy committees to meet prior to June 6
- May 25 Last day for fiscal committees to hear & report bills
- May 29 – June 1
Floor Session Only. No committee may meet for any purpose
- June 1 Last day for bills to be passed out of the house of origin

Legislative Calendar

Key Dates:

- Jun 4 Committee meetings may resume
- Jun 15 Budget must be passed by midnight (Art. IV, Sec. 12 (c)(3)).
- Jun 28 Last Day for a legislative measure to qualify for the Nov. 2014 ballot
- July 6 Last Day for policy committees to meet & report bills
Summer Recess begins upon adjournment (if budget passed)
- Aug. 6 Reconvene from Summer Recess
- Aug. 17 Last day for fiscal committees to meet & report bills to the Floor
- Aug. 24 Last day to amend bills on the Floor

Aug. 20–31

Floor Session only. No committees, other than Conference Committees & Rules Committee, may meet for any purpose

- Aug. 31 Last day for each house to pass bills (Art. IV, Sec. 10 (c))
Final Recess begins at the end of this day's session




