
1) Key Concepts

- Multi-Level Compliance
- Delegation
 - Legislature vs Agencies
 - State Implementation of Federal Laws
- Federalism/ State's Rights



Must Comply with All Laws and Doctrines Simultaneously

Environmental Laws and Regulations



Legislation vs Agencies

- Legislature makes laws
 - Federal example: United States Code (USC)
 - State example: Public Resources Code (PRC)
- Agencies regulate, implement & enforce the law
 - Federal: Administrative Procedures Act (APA)
 - State: California Administrative Procedures Act
- Effective participation



2) Framework of State Environmental and Water Laws

Federal

- Reclamation Acts, Central Valley Project (CVP)
- Clean Water Act (CWA)
- Safe Drinking Water Act
- Endangered Species Act
- National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)
- State
 - State Water Project (SWP)
 - Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act
 - California Endangered Species Act (CESA)
 - California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)



A) Water Management

- Store and convey Water for multiple purposes
- US Bureau of Reclamation (USBR/ BoR)
 - Central Valley Project (CVP)
 - Reclamation Acts, Central Valley Project Improvement Act (CVPIA)
- Department of Water Resources (DWR)
 - State Water Project (SWP)







B) Water Quality: CWA, Safe Drinking Water Act, Porter-Cologne

- Law: CWA (33 USC § 1251 et seq. (1972)
 - Pollutant discharge to Waters of the United States
- Agencies share administration and enforcement authority
 - Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)
 - National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)
 - U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE/ Corps)
 - Section 401, Section 404



CWA

- Delegation
- NPDES combined with Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) for water quality standards
- California EPA (Cal EPA)
- State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB/ Water Board)
- Regional Water Quality Control Boards (Regional Boards/RWQCB)



C) Federal: Safe Drinking Water Act

- 42 USC § 300 (f) et seq. (1974)
- CWA authorizes EPA to set water quality standards for drinking water
- EPA regulations have legally enforceable standards for certain contaminants
 - 40 CFR § § 141-143



State: Safe Drinking Water Act

- EPA delegated authority to CA
 - SWRCB, Division of Drinking Water
 - Public Water Systems/ Health
- Public Water Systems
 - System for provision to public of water for human consumption
 - 15 + connections, or 25+ people



State: Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act

- California Water Code §13000 et seq. (1969)
- Grants SWRCB authority over CA water quality
- Establishes 9 Regional Water Quality Control Boards (RWQCB) by water basin
 - Water quality control plans, Certificates, NPDES permit
 - Implement CWA, Section 401 and Section 404







C) Endangered Species Acts

- Federal Endangered Species Act
 - 16 USC §§ 1531- 1544 (1973)
 - Listing of species and habitat
 - Section 7
 - US Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS)
 - National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS)
 - Biological Assessment (BA)
 - Biological Opinion (BiOp or BO)
 - Reasonable and Prudent Alternative (RPA)



ESA

Section 9

- Take prohibition
- Habitat modification as take
- Section 10
 - Incidental Take Statements (ITS)
 - Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP)



California ESA (CESA)

- CA Fish & Game Code § 2050 *et seq*. (1984)
 - California Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW)
- State agencies consult with DFW to ensure actions will not jeopardize listed species
- Differences with ESA
 - Same species, different listings
- Different terms from ESA: See handout













D) Delta Reform Act

- Delta Reform Act
 - Legislative package: SB X 7 1 (2009)
 - CA Water Code § 85054
 - Co-equal goals
 - New standards for groundwater monitoring, statewide water conservation, enforcement of Delta diversions
- Delta Stewardship Council
- Delta Conservancy
- Delta Watermaster



E) Environmental Review Laws

- National Environmental Policy Act
 - 42 USC § 4321 et seq. (1970)
 - Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) regulations
 - 40 CFR § § 1500-1508
- Federal agency decision on discretionary action
- Environmental impacts
 - Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)
 - Alternatives
 - Mitigation



Environmental Review, continued

- California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)
 - Public Resources Code § 21000 et seq. (1976)
 - CA Code of Regulations (CCR) 15 CCR § 15000 et seq.
 - Project: activity undertaken, approved, or financed by a state or local government agency
 - Environmental Impact Report (EIR), Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND), Negative Declaration (ND)
 - Alternatives
 - Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP)
- Water and Land Use: identify water supply for project, Water Code § 10910 et seq.



NEPA and CEQA

- See handout
- Joint NEPA/ CEQA documents common
- Federal nexus such as funding triggers NEPA


