

North Coast: Watersheds to the Sea K-8 Project WET Educator Workshop February 4, 4:00-6:00 and February 18, 4:00-5:30 Live Zoom

Join a **Project WET** hybrid workshop experience exploring activities that engage students in the study of our local watershed connections to the Pacific Ocean in addition to skills, concepts and teaching practices at the heart of NGSS and Common Core standards.



Begin the workshop upon registration exploring Project WET activities at your own pace before engaging 'live' online. The interdisciplinary activities of Project WET include real-life scenarios, use of data and emphasis on critical thinking. Project WET activities are designed to supplement existing curriculum and are *correlated to Common Core and Next Generation Science Standards*. Project WET activities support and expand on existing curriculum and provide strong foundations for STEAM, Project-Based and Service-Learning programs.

The training will include an introduction to the use of Project WET standards pools by grade bands as models to *Chart Your Own Course* in using Project WET activities, plus an introduction to local citizen science or **stewardship opportunities** that would allow students to apply what they learn – whether learning in class or at home with parents.



Participants will be mailed a copy of Project WET Guide 2.0, an agenda showing standard connections, free access to new Project WET online Portal, resources for action projects, and an option to receive CEU credits for a fee.
